Some expex Linguistic Examples

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- (1) This is an example.
- (2) a. There is a pair of pants on the floor.
 - b. ?*There are a pair of pants on the floor.
 - c. *There is the pair of pants on the floor.
- (3) a. $sy\acute{a}$ lu- $ken\acute{i}k\acute{e}ni$ DI 11firely/11star 'small/tiny firefly/star'
 - b. * $sy\acute{a}$ luto/lwito
 DI 11ashes

Each example can have a tag in angular brackets <>.

Example 1 is the simplest example you can create with expex. Then example 2 shows how you can add judgement marks.

Example parts can also be tagged and referenced; but remember that the 'main' example needs to have a tag, too. You may want to use \getfullref instead of \getref. See the difference: 3a vs a.
